The Course will run on April 8, 9, and 10, 2024, between 9:30-13:00 (Italian Time), for 13 hours in total. Professors Porat and Pin will teach students of both Schools remotely in an interactive fashion. Israeli and Italian students will have the chance to discuss cases and reflect upon thorny topics of comparative constitutional law together. After the completion of the Course, each School will grade their students autonomously.

Comparative constitutional law has emerged as a field of scholarship and as a technique that enriches constitutional reforms and adjudication with foreign ideals, materials, and experiences. However, it is subject to intense criticism because it would influence domestic law with mechanisms and solutions that do not enjoy popular support.

The Course will focus on pros and cons of comparative law as a scholarship and a technique, and identify a set of constitutional ideals, principles, and rights that have characterized its rise.

Due to the structure of the Course, no more than 20 students per School will be admitted.

The Professors of the Course will issue a joint-certificate to the students who will have attended the course in its entirety.

Students are expected to read the assignments before classes.
